There were overages in the ADA ramps which were slightly offset by some reduced quantities for planter box repairs resulting in a total change of \$13,685.00.

On July 18, 2023, bids were opened for the State Road 19 Streetscape project at the regular Board of Works meeting. Two (2) bids were received at that time and given to the City's Engineering Department for review.

The bids have been reviewed and the results are as follows:

\$7,394,177.00
\$8,807,275.00

There were no discrepancies with any of the quotes. Premium Concrete was the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, and they have successfully completed projects in the past for the City of Elkhart.

There are sufficient Redevelopment funds already appropriated for this project.



The Department of Public Work & Utilities requests permission to advertise the Water Service Line Investigation Project. This project will utilize a forgivable loan from the Indiana Finance Authority (IFA). IFA has approved the project, but receiving bids is one step in finalizing funding. The approved funding is for up to \$400,000.

The project will consist of contractors utilizing vacuum excavation at residential curb-stop valves with unknown service line materials to determine the water service line material on both sides of the cub-stop valve. A list of addresses to investigate will be available to bidders. Investigations will focus on an historic portion of the City of Elkhart. Bidders will be instructed to provide the maximum number of addresses from the list that they can investigate for a total price not to exceed \$400,000.

McDowell Enterprises submitted their self-monitoring report, (SMR), for the month of May 2023 to Public Works on June 28, 2023. In this SMR there are exceedances for **nickel daily max**, and **monthly average**, also for **zinc daily max** and **monthly average**.

McDowell's categorical limits for nickel at the sample port riser pipe location is daily max limit of 3.98 mg/L, and a monthly average limit of 2.38 mg/L.

McDowell's categorical limits for zinc at the sample port riser pipe location is daily max limit of 2.61 mg/L, and a monthly average limit of 1.48 mg/L.

The SMR results for nickel for the month of May 2023 is 5.3 mg/L, and the SMR result for zinc for the month of May 2023 is 26.3 mg/L. The four infractions are the exceedances for nickel, and zinc daily max and monthly averages.

Per the City of Elkhart Enforcement Response Plan, Penalty Matrix, 9.1.1 Discharging wastewater containing metals in excess of established limits per parameter when no damage, recommended penalty \$400.

Approval of Agreement between the City of Elkhart and Indiana Rail

Foundation, Inc.

The National New York Central Railroad Museum seeks approval of the Asset Transfer Agreement between the City of Elkhart and Indiana Rail Foundation, Inc. for the transfer of specific museum assets as outlined in the agreement. In exchange for the assets, the Museum will receive both cash and in-kind contributions that will benefit the Museum in their efforts and future endeavors.

It is requested that the Board of Public Works approve the Agreement with Indiana Rail Foundation, Inc. for the transfer of museum assets.

ASSET TRANSFER AGREEMENT

This Asset Transfer Agreement (this "Agr	eement") is made l	between the City of
Elkhart, a legal Indiana municipality (the "City")	, and Indiana Rail	Foundation, Inc., an
Indiana corporation (the "Contractor") on this	day of	, 2023.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Contractor desires to acquire certain assets maintained by City, and City is willing to deaccess such assets to Contractor, on the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, for the good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

<u>Definitions</u>. As used herein, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

- A. Assets. The term "Assets" shall mean **New York Central steam locomotive No. 3001 and tender; and No. 3042, an auxiliary water tender.**
- B. Abandonment. The term abandonment shall mean that the Contractor's company has dissolved or that the Asset is left unattended for a period of four years.
- 1. Transfer of Assets. Subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, at the Closing referred to herein, City agrees to transfer and assign and Contractor agrees to accept on the terms stated herein, all of City's right, title, and interest in and to the Assets, including, without limitation, the following:
- <u>1.1. Additional Property</u>. All of the property relating to the Assets shall be transferred to the Contractor, including the following:
- (a). Locomotive Materials and Components. The City shall provide all apparatus, materials, components, parts, gauges, and tools from 3001 that may be in storage or on display. Contractor agrees to not request these items until it supplies appropriate alternatives (i.e. signage, display boards, informational material) or comparable replacements. Understanding that some material may be currently used in museum exhibits, displays, or storage, Contractor agrees to provide the City with 90 days notice of the need to remove these materials.

2. Additional Provisions.

2.1. <u>Abandonment Clause</u>. City and Contractor agree that the Museum of the American Railroad, a Texas non-profit organization, was chiefly responsible for the

original preservation of New York Central Steam Locomotive No. 3001 and its relocation to Elkhart, Indiana. In recognition of historical agreements regarding the disposition of the Asset, the Contractor and City agree that should the Asset be abandoned and the Contractor's entity is dissolved, the Museum of the American Railroad will have the right to reclaim, at its own expense, New York Central Steam Locomotive No. 3001.

- 2.2 Assignment of Contracts. City agrees to assign or cause to be assigned to Contractor, as of the Closing, all of the rights of Asset under the Contracts that are assignable to any third party, provided any assignment includes an abandonment definition and an abandonment clause in favor of the Museum of the American Railroad, similar to those found in this contract. Contractor shall assume, as of the Closing, all obligations of City thereunder which arise before, at or after Closing. Contractor may assign or cause to assign all rights of the Asset under the Contract to any third party. Through the course of inspection, preparation, removal, or restoration, and operation of Asset, if such is deemed feasible, Contractor reserves the right to transfer Asset to a separate holding company or non-profit entity dedicated solely to maintaining, restoring, and operating the Asset in order to carry out its obligations.
- <u>2.3 Access, Right of Entry, and Removal</u>. City will permit Contractor and third-parties retained by Contractor to enter and access Asset on the grounds, property, and facilities of 721 S Main St, Elkhart, IN 46516. City will provide to Contractor a gate key for ease of access and Contractor will notify City of its arrival/departure from City property. Contractor agrees to provide City 24 hours notice of entrance to the property.
 - (a) Contractor shall provide a plan for removal within 160 days of Closing Date.

(b)

- (c) Contractor agrees to remove Asset from the property within four years of Closing Date.
- (d) Contractor is solely responsible for coordinating the relocation and removal of Asset with railroad and/or moving companies and contractors.
- (e) Contractor will be responsible for any track work needed to facilitate the removal of Asset by rail.
- (f) Prior to obtaining a key, Contractor will provide the City with a certificate of insurance, naming the City of Elkhart, Indiana 229 S. Second Street, Elkhart, Indiana 46516 as an additional insured in the amount of one (1) million per claim and three (3) million aggregate for general liability, including personal injury, and for property insurance.
- (g) City shall not be liable to Contractor or third parties retained by Contractor, their agents, servants, employees, contractors, customers or invitees for any damage to person or property caused by any act, omission, or neglect, of City. Contractor agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless City of, from and against any and all losses, damages, liabilities, claims, liens, costs and expenses (including but not limited to court costs, reasonable attorney's fees and litigation expenses) in connection with injury to or death of any person or damage to or theft, loss or loss of the use of any property occurring in or about the premises arising from Contractor's or its agent's access to the property, or the conduct of their activities in or about the

premises, or from any act or omission or willful misconduct of contractor or its persons, agents, employees, contractors, assigns, guests, or invitees arising out of contractor's access to the 721 S. Main Street, Elkhart, Indiana.

- <u>2.5. Liabilities Assumed by Contractor</u>. Contractor shall, effective as of the Closing and without any further responsibility or liability of or recourse to City, or its directors, shareholders, officers, partners, employees, agents, consultants, representatives, successors, transferees or assignees, absolutely and irrevocably assume and shall be liable and responsible for the claims, liabilities, and obligations of City.
- 2.6. <u>City Representations and Disclaimer of Warranties</u>. Contractor agrees it is hereby removing and Asset "AS IS" and "WHERE IS" and "WITH ALL FAULTS" and City make no warranties of any kind, express or implied, regarding the Goods, their quality and/or condition, title, marketability, or otherwise with respect to the Assets, whether or not disclosed to Contractor, and whether or not occurring or arising prior to, at or after Closing.
- 2.7. <u>Taxes</u>. Contractor shall pay or cause to be paid all sales, use, registration, and other tax liabilities, if any, resulting from the Transaction and/or removal of the Goods, and Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless City therefrom.
- 3. <u>Consideration</u>. In accordance with the provisions of this Agreement, the Consideration submitted to City by Contractor for the Assets is as follows:
 - a) Strategic Plan Development. Contractor will consult and retain qualified rail preservation, marketing, and grantwriting firms, such as Fort Wayne Railroad Historical Society, FMW Solutions, New York Central System Historical Society, their representatives, and others, to develop a strategic plan which envisions the Museum as an event and program-driven community destination and facilitates community outreach and input for the plan. In addition, creation of this strategic plan will drive the creation of a new and permanent informational, educational, and promotional website for the National New York Central Railroad Museum. The City will be responsible for hosting costs and related internet services to support this website and the hosting and publication of the strategic plan. This plan and website will be due within 12 months of Closing Date. The value of this consideration is \$55,000.
 - b) Equipment Deaccession Plan. Working with qualified rail preservation, marketing, and grantwriting firms and the Museum, Contractor will assess which equipment is most historically relevant and significant to Elkhart and the Museum and make recommendations on which equipment should remain in the Museum's collection and for what purpose in order to reduce the Museum's burden of maintaining and preserving equipment stored outdoors, some of which may not have long term strategic or educational value in its current state or condition. In addition, Contractor will create a de-accession plan for superfluous equipment and establish avenues by

which equipment may be made available for acquisition by qualified entities within the general railroad preservation community or the Contractor itself. Contractor will assist with removal and disposal of identified equipment by identifying qualified and reputable firms, organizations, entities, or individuals capable of responsibly moving, relocating, preserving, and/or disposing of surplus equipment, rolling stock, and misc. items, including parts or scrap items at their own cost. City agrees to permit Contractor or the Fort Wayne Railroad Historical Society first right of refusal for any equipment deemed surplus. This deaccession plan will be due within 9 months of Closing Date. *The value of this consideration is \$15,000*.

- c) <u>Museum Contribution of \$20,000</u>. Contractor will facilitate a cash contribution to the National New York Central Museum to be used exclusively for planning, equipment stabilization, and facility improvements as well as other items detailed in the Strategic Plan. This contribution will be made upon delivery of the Strategic Development Plan or at an earlier date as determined by the Contractor. *The actual value of this consideration is \$20,000*.
- d) City and Museum Recognition. Contractor will commit that the City of Elkhart and National New York Central Railroad Museum receive fair and adequate coverage, inclusion, marketing, and connection to Asset in perpetuity; and that the City of Elkhart and National New York Central Museum will be promoted in digital and traditional media content and publications related to the City through the course of the inspection, preservation, and any eventual removal, overhaul, restoration, or operation of the Asset if Contractor deems that such restoration is feasible. While Contractor cannot guarantee that Asset will operate in or through the City of Elkhart upon completion of a successful mechanical restoration, Contractor commits to making every good faith effort to negotiate, secure, and execute the operation, exhibition, staging, visitation, and/or stop-over of Asset in City at a time to be determined by the connecting railroads. Contractor affirms both it and its vendors, contractors, partners, and supporters have the relationships, history, and resources to encourage this consideration, but City understands that the viability of this is entirely contingent on the support of connecting railroads. The actual value of this consideration is \$350,000.

3. Closing.

- 3.1 Date of Closing. The Closing shall take place no more than thirty (30) days following the date last of the last signatory to this Agreement signs, at such place, date and time as the parties may agree in writing, unless a later date is mutually designated by City and Contractor.
- 3.2 Documents to be Delivered by City. At or prior to the Closing, City shall deliver, or cause to be delivered, documents of transfer, bills of sale, certificates of title, or other

instruments of transfer, dated the Closing Date, transferring to Contractor title to the Assets. If no title is available, City will provide Contractor with a Quit Claim deed.

4. Conduct of the City Pending Closing.

- a) Between the date hereof and the Closing Date, City shall continue to use the Assets in the ordinary course and in a manner reasonably consistent with its present operating plan.
- b) City will not take any action, (i) the result of which will be to create a Material Adverse Effect on the value of the Assets, or (ii) which is both not reasonably consistent with its normal operating plan and not in the ordinary course of business.

5. Representations of City. City represents to Contractor that:

- <u>5.1 Organization, Standing and Authority</u>. City is a municipal corporation organized, existing, and in good standing under the laws of Indiana and has the full corporate power and authority to enter into and to perform this Agreement.
- 5.2 Authorization of Agreement; Authority. The performance of this Agreement by City is subject to the approval of the Elkhart Board of Public Works, which the City will seek in good faith. Upon approval by the Board of Public Works, this Agreement will constitute the valid and binding obligation of City, enforceable in accordance with its terms, except to the extent enforceability may be limited by bankruptcy, insolvency, reorganization, moratorium or other similar laws affecting the enforcement of creditors' rights in general and subject to general principles of equity (regardless of whether such enforceability is considered in a proceeding inequity or at law). Upon approval, the execution, delivery, and performance of this Agreement by City will not (a) violate or conflict with the City's power and authority; (b) constitute a violation of any law, regulation, order, writ, judgment, injunction or decree applicable to City; or (c) subject to the receipt of appropriate consents as specified in this Agreement as of the Closing Date, conflict with, or result in the breach of the provisions of, or constitute a default under, any agreement, license, permit or other instrument to which City is a party or is bound or by which the Assets are bound.

<u>6. Representations of Contractor</u>. Contractor represents to City as follows:

- <u>6.1 Contractor's Organization</u>. Contractor is a corporation organized, existing, and in good standing under the laws of Indiana, and has the full corporate power and authority to enter into and to perform this Agreement.
- <u>6.2 Authorization of Agreement</u>. The execution, delivery, and performance of this Agreement by the Contractor have been duly authorized by all necessary corporate action of the Contractor, and this Agreement constitutes the valid and binding obligation of Contractor enforceable against it in accordance with its terms, except to the extent

enforceability may be limited by bankruptcy, insolvency or other similar laws affecting the enforcement of creditors 'rights in general and subject to general principles of equity (regardless of whether such enforceability is considered in a proceeding in equity or at law).

6.3. The City of Elkhart represents that the City acquired possession and ultimately ownership of the Mohawk and Tender under a 100-year lease agreement dated December 20, 1988, between the Lakeshore Railroad Historical Foundation, Inc. and the National New York Central Railroad Museum, a department of the City of Elkhart. The City further acknowledge that the lease agreement includes the following the provision:

In the event Lakeshore dissolves or ceases to function as an active corporation, full ownership of the Mohawk and Tender, and the rolling stock referred to in paragraph 8 shall vest in Museum. In such event, Museum shall take title to the Mohawk and Tender subject to the first option granted to Southwest Railroad Historical Society as contained in paragraph 7 of their agreement with Lakeshore dated June 14, 1983.

- 6.4 The City represents that Lakeshore Railroad Historical Foundation, Inc. was administratively dissolved by the State of Indiana on or about September 9, 2017.
- 6.5 The City will prior to Closing, forthwith pursue additional assurances that the City's claim of title to the Mohawk is free and clear of any claim by Lakeshore; and the parties agree that the execution of a quit claim deed, instrument of release, or action to quiet title. Notwithstanding, such representations, if, prior to Closing, the City is unable to secure title, free and clear of any claim by Lakeshore Railroad Historical Foundation Inc. in the Mohawk and Tender, then, at the option of either party to this Asset Transfer Agreement, shall terminate. Upon termination under this provision, both parties are released of all obligations under this Agreement, and neither party will have any recourse against the other, for any claim arising from this Agreement.
- The City represents that neither, the City of Elkhart nor Southwest Railroad 6.6 Historical Society (now known as Museum of the American Railroad, Inc.) has been able to locate a copy of the above-referenced agreement between Southwest and Lakeshore, dated June 14, 1983. As such, the parties acknowledge an undefined "first option granted to Southwest Railroad Historical Society" which may, or may not, encumber title to the Mohawk and Tender. The parties agree to pursue in good faith such consents, releases, disclaimers, or other agreements with or by Southwest Railroad Historical Society, which are acceptable to Contractor. However, if the parties are unable to secure such assurances which are acceptable to Contractor, then, Contractor may terminate this Asset Transfer Agreement. If Contractor elects to terminate this Agreement under this provision, both parties are released of all obligations under this Agreement, and neither party will have any recourse against the other, for any claim arising from this Agreement. However, if Contractor elects to close the transaction, without such assurances from Southwest, then the title to the Mohawk and Tender shall pass subject to the claims of Southwest, if any.

7. Further Agreements of the Parties.

- 7.2 Notice of Changes and Events. Each party shall promptly notify the other party in writing, and furnish to such party any information that such party may reasonably request, with respect to the occurrence of any event or the existence of any state of facts that would (i) result in the party's representations and warranties not being true if they were made at any time prior to or as of the Closing Date, or (ii) impair the party's ability to perform its obligations under this Agreement.

- 7.4 Publicity. Contractor and City shall consult with each other before issuing any public announcement or press release concerning the transactions contemplated by this Agreement. If Contractor or City is so required to make a public announcement or issue a press release such party shall use its best efforts to inform the other party hereto prior to making or issuing it. City shall be recognized in perpetuity for its role in the preservation of
- <u>7.5 Termination</u>. This Agreement shall be terminated at any time prior to the Closing: (a). by a mutual written agreement executed by City and Contractor.

8. Default; Remedies; Arbitration.

<u>8.1 Default; Remedies</u>. Time is of the essence of this Agreement. If either party fails or refuses to carry out this Agreement according to its terms, the other party shall be entitled to the remedies set forth below.

9. Related Matters.

- <u>9.1 Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement contains, and is intended as, a complete statement of all of the terms of the arrangements between the parties with respect to the matters provided for, supersedes any previous agreements and understandings between the parties with respect to those matters, and cannot be changed or terminated orally.
- <u>9.2 Governing Law.</u> City and Contractor each hereby consent to personal jurisdiction in any action brought with respect to this Agreement and the transactions contemplated hereunder in Indiana and to the arbitration described in Section 8 of this Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the law of the State of Indiana.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF ELKHART AND THE ELKHART MUNICIPAL BAND FOR TRANSPORTATION OF CERTAIN EQUIPMENT

This Agreement is made and entered into this 5th day of September, 2023, by and between the CITY OF ELKHART, INDIANA, an Indiana Municipal Corporation, acting through its Board of Public Works (the "City"), and the ELKHART MUNICIPAL BAND (the "Band");

WHEREAS, Band has partnered with the City for the past several years to give public concerts, performances, and appearances without charge to the public;

WHEREAS, the partnership between City and Band has been successful and both parties desire to continue this partnership; and

WHEREAS the Band is in need of transportation of its equipment to Wellfield Botanic Gardens located at 1011 N. Main Street, Elkhart, Indiana 46514 for a concert to take place on September 10, 2023.

In consideration of the foregoing and the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereby agree as follows:

- The City's Department of Buildings and Grounds shall provide transportation of the Elkhart Municipal Band's equipment, to include tympani, music stands, bass drum and the conductor's podium.
- 2. The transportation of the equipment shall be from McNaughton Park to Wellfield Botanic Gardens, where the equipment is stored, and back to McNaughton Park after the concert.
- 3. The transportation prior to the concert shall take place prior to 1:00 pm on September 10, 2023 so that the equipment shall be available for the scheduled rehearsal to take place at 1:00 pm on September 10, 2023. The Elkhart Municipal Band shall be responsible for removing their equipment from the vehicle/trailer used to transport the equipment.
- 4. The transportation after the concert shall take place on Tuesday, September 12, 2023. The Band shall be responsible for placing their equipment in the vehicle/trailer to be used to transport the equipment back to McNaughton Park.
- 5. No bailor/bailee relationship is created by this agreement.

- 6. The City shall not be responsible for any damage to the equipment under any circumstances.
- 7. The Band, including its officers, directors, agents, employees, and affiliates, agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City, its successors, assigns, directors, officers, employees, agents, and any other person for whom the City may be legally liable ("Indemnified Parties"), from and against any and all costs, expenses (including attorney's fees), interest, losses, obligations, liabilities, or damages paid ("Losses") which may accrue to or be incurred or sustained by the Indemnified Parties, and which arise out of or are in connection with or are for the purpose of avoiding any and all claims, demands, actions, causes of action, suits, appeals, and proceedings ("Claims"), all whether groundless or not, or the settlement thereof, based on actual or alleged injuries, damages, or liability of any kind whatsoever, made or brought against the Indemnified Parties, sustained in connection with this Agreement, arising from any cause whatsoever except for gross negligence and willful misconduct of the Indemnified Parties. The Band further agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the Indemnified Parties from and against any and all liability, damage, loss, cost, or expense which may accrue to or be sustained by the Band, the Band's members, guests or any other party with property being transported by the City.
- 8. Governing Law—It is the intention of Parties to this Agreement all suits and special proceedings under this Agreement, be construed in accordance with and governed, to the exclusion of the law of any other forum, by the laws of the State of Indiana, without regard to the jurisdiction in which any action or special proceeding may be instituted.
- 9. Severability—Should there be a conflict between any provision of this Agreement and applicable laws of the State of Indiana said laws will prevail and such provisions of the Agreement will be amended or deleted as necessary in order to comply with said laws.
- 10. Modification—This Agreement may be supplemented, amended, or modified only by the mutual agreement of Parties. No supplement, amendment or modification of this Agreement shall be binding unless it is in writing and signed by all parties.
